# Community Issues Paper

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April 2018 | Volume 1

# 01. Overview

This Community Issues Paper sets out to document and summarise key issues that have emerged from each of the PPN Linkage Groups. The document is intended to be used to focus the PPN's advocacy around community issues in the coming years. It will serve as a key resource for the PPN to lobby the Council or other state agencies and decision makers.

To gather issues from community members, workshops were conducted with the eight Linkage Groups in the PPN. 102 PPN members were asked what they considered to be the main issues that affect their areas and communities. 121 themed issues are identified in this paper across the eight Linkage Groups.

## Sustainable Development Goals

In line with the Fingal PPN Strategic Plan 2018 – 2021, issues for each of the Linkage Groups are themed by the relevant United Nations (UN) Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) see Figure 1 below for the SDGs.

## 02. Arts, Community, Heritage and Sport

**Table 1: Issues Identified by the Arts, Community, Heritage and Sport Linkage Group**

| Thematic Area                             | Issue  |

| <b>Arts:</b><br>Events                    | Increase the number of individual event open nights for art exhibitions to be promoted alongside talks on art and culture.   |
| <b>Arts:</b><br>Youth and New Communities | Fingal County Council to build on and raise greater awareness of school and community programmes to encourage participation in the arts, particularly from young people and new Irish communities living in Fingal.  |
| <b>Community:</b><br>Facilities           | <p>Ensure community facilities are affordable and accessible across Fingal, especially to local volunteer led groups. This will enable them to run arts, culture and support groups for the local community. Community facilities should be appropriately equipped to facilitate performances and exhibitions as well as general group meetings.</p> <p>All new community buildings to be appropriate for disabled access.</p> <p>A gap analysis to be carried out by Fingal County Council to identify community facilities with the least access for residents and capital expenditure to be prioritised in these areas.</p> |
| <b>Community:</b><br>Hubs                 | Explore the potential of Community Hubs being rolled out through existing community facilities. Community Hubs could facilitate satellite community based services and clinics such as Citizen's information, Family Resource Centre, Youth Services and more.   |
| <b>Community:</b><br>Planning             | <p>Investigate the potential of commercial rates exemptions being provided to vacant commercial premises being used by volunteer led community groups selling artworks, crafts or other volunteer produced products.</p> <p>Local planning to have a focus on ensuring adequate provision of designated play areas for children and suitable cultural/arts recreational facilities for young people.</p>   |

| <b>Community:</b><br>Wellbeing      | Local services to implement the Green Gym programme across Fingal to promote good health and positive mental wellbeing and to bring the outdoors to people of all ages.   |
| <b>Heritage:</b><br>Greenways       | Greenways to be established linking villages in Fingal, so that people can work safely between locations and enjoy the natural environment. This would reduce residents driving across the county reducing Fingal's carbon footprint. This will also increase local fitness and health.<br><br>Fingal County Council to plan, resource and implement the Fingal Coastal Greenway.   |
| <b>Heritage:</b><br>Local Ownership | Local groups to be supported by Fingal PPN to engage in protecting the local heritage.<br><br>Communities to be engaged in projects in a community development manner to develop and promote their local heritage.<br><br>Fingal County Council to promote the historical value of towns and villages (such as Lusk and Rush), empowering communities to develop, run and sustain community based visitor centres.  |
| <b>Heritage:</b><br>Nature          | A policy to be developed to ensure that developers who remove trees and hedgerows to replace these with the planting of an equivalent number native Irish trees and hedgerows, etc.<br><br>Fingal PPN to engage in a discussion on the need for regulation for a minimum required area of green space and gardens in all new housing developments to support biodiversity and rainfall management and flooding.   |
| <b>Sports:</b><br>Activities        | Fingal County Council to subsidise an increased range of low cost community sporting activities and facilities to ensure access for those on low incomes. Including 'low-hitters' i.e. smaller/niche sports such as orienteering and cycling.<br><br>Fingal County Council to work on a cohesive strategy for usage of the coastline in Fingal focusing in particular on water sports. To work on the less established type of sporting activities for those not involved in the established sports clubs (i.e. wind surfing, rock climbing).<br><br>Local groups to have access to sports facilities that cater to a variety of groups, sports and ages. |
| <b>Sports:</b><br>Swimming Pools    | Fingal County Council to invest resources in community swimming pools similar to the pools provided by Dublin City Council.   |

| <b>Crime Prevention:</b><br>Abandoned Cars        | Fingal County Council and An Garda Síochána to clarify and coordinate their responsibilities in relation to dealing with abandoned cars throughout Fingal with the potential for a collaborative programme to be rolled out.   |
| <b>Crime Prevention:</b><br>Anti-social Behaviour | <p>Members of the community get an appropriate and timely response from Community Gardaí in relation to anti-social behaviour in public places. Priority areas include: Dart lines, stations, beaches, parks, housing estates and late-night venues.</p> <p>Community Gardaí lead a multi-agency plan aimed at reducing anti-social behaviour.</p> <p>CCTV to be put up in public spaces where it is required to deter anti-social behaviour.</p> <p>Parents are supported to take ownership for their children’s anti-social behaviour.</p> <p>There to be better lighting and signage in areas of persistent crime.</p> <p>There to be more activities and facilities for young people in the area in order to support them to keep away from criminal activity.</p>   |
| <b>Crime Prevention:</b><br>Communications        | <p>Gardaí to use a multitude of mechanisms to engage with the community and issues alerts in relevant areas where necessary. This should include social media, text alerts, newsletters, etc.</p> <p>Email addresses for Garda Divisions in Fingal to be published for non-emergency communication, this is especially useful for areas that do not have a local Garda station.</p> <p>Communities to be supported to setup, develop and reactivate Neighbourhood Watch. This should include training, networking opportunities and text alert systems. This could be done in partnership with the PPN.</p> <p>The PPN and Gardaí to continue to work together to promote a strong link between local communities and local Garda Stations</p> <p>Local Garda stations to establish a message response system when unable to answer the station phone.</p> |

| <b>Crime Prevention:</b><br>Garda Presence                | <p>All Garda Stations to be open 24 hours a day.</p> <p>Community Gardaí numbers to be increased to facilitate meaningful, sustainable partnerships within the community.</p> <p>Community Gardaí need ring-fenced time to avoid being diverted to other posts which results in lost opportunities for the community to engage with Gardaí on issues.</p>  |
| <b>Crime Prevention:</b><br>Litter Prevention and Control | Sufficient litter wardens and community based programmes to be provided to prevent littering in public spaces. This includes fly-tipping, litter, graffiti, abandoned cars and bonfires.   |
| <b>Crime Prevention:</b><br>Planning                      | <p>Increase transparency with the public on plans for reducing crime at community level. Planning processes to involve research into what works well in other communities, i.e. crime prevention through environmental design.</p> <p>New estates to be designed to facilitate the combatting of anti-social behaviour, reckless driving and lighting black-spots.</p>   |
| <b>Crime Prevention:</b><br>Reduction of Theft            | <p>Increase safety precautions to prevent car theft in car parks, neighbourhoods and local communities through local community based education and awareness raising initiatives.</p> <p>Increase the use of CCTV cameras on Main Streets, in railway stations, car parks and beaches (to include static Automatic Number Plate Recognition / ANPR cameras).</p> <p>Establish a campaign for citizens to become active in preventing crime with actions such as reporting of crime and marking property (by providing access to marking machines).</p> |
| <b>Crime Prevention:</b><br>Response Times                | Efforts to be made to ensure Garda emergency response times are appropriate. Response times should be monitored and reported on publicly with any issues to be identified and addressed.   |
| <b>Crime Prevention:</b><br>Road Safety                   | <p>Road safety initiatives to be developed to focus on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Illegal parking (disability spaces, loading bays, yellow lines, controlled parking zones, etc.).</li> <li>• Speeding and antisocial driving in areas.</li> <li>• Nuisance and unsafe vehicle use around schools, specifically during drop-offs and pickups.</li> <li>• Zero tolerance towards untaxed vehicles, expired NCTs and uninsured drivers.</li> </ul>  |

| <b>Economy:</b><br>Education                          | There is a need for increased vocational training colleges and educational campuses based within Fingal. These to support access to programmes connected to local employment as well as supporting transition into other third level programmes.   |
| <b>Economy:</b><br>Foreign Direct Investment and Jobs | Fingal needs to continue to be represented at and engaged with the IDA and local Chambers of Commerce to ensure that Fingal remains competitive for, is attractive to and considered for foreign direct investment and job creation.   |
| <b>Tourism:</b><br>Accommodation                      | There is not sufficient tourist accommodation in Fingal, council planning to include provision for strategically located accommodation options to support increased tourism in Fingal.   |
| <b>Tourism:</b><br>Dublin Plan                        | Explore the feasibility of a Dublin wide tourism plan and if this would lead to achieving the best tourism outcomes for Fingal through dividing and focusing markets.  |
| <b>Tourism:</b><br>Fingal as a Destination            | <p>Fingal is an area rich in tourist destinations, which could be further optimised. To support the branding of the area as a unique tourist destination, the following should be progressed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Development and marketing of tourist/recreational pathways and day trips, particularly the delivery of the Fingal Coastal Way (a cycleway/walkway which links to major heritage sites, parks and beaches).</li> <li>• The Fingal Coastal Way is an objective of the Development Plan 2017-2023 and should be front-loaded.</li> <li>• On-going publicity and relationship building with tourism operators and agencies.</li> <li>• Continued development of events and festivals throughout Fingal.</li> <li>• Further development of tourism and cultural offices, to include local merchandise and branding.</li> </ul> |

| <b>The Environment:</b><br>All Ireland<br>Pollination Plan | <p>Fingal has a clear strategy for implementing the All Ireland Pollinator Plan in order to ensure that harmful weed killers are no longer affecting local wildlife and pollinators.</p> <p>There is an education campaign developed to raise awareness about simple, practical steps to improve the health of pollinators.</p>  |
| <b>The Environment:</b><br>Climate Change                  | <p>Greater promotion of campaigns and programmes to assist residents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Retrofitting of homes to reduce energy use and promote energy efficiency.</li> <li>• Embrace renewable energy production i.e. photovoltaic on rooftops.</li> </ul>  |
| <b>The Environment:</b><br>Domestic Waste                  | <p>Increase compliance with the lawful disposal of household waste by identifying households that are not subscribed to a waste collection service.</p>  |
| <b>The Environment:</b><br>Fly-tipping                     | <p>Members of the community are involved in a local campaign to raise awareness and reduce illegal dumping in public spaces.</p> <p>Review the enforcement of regulations/bylaws/legislation in relation to Fly tipping with a view to creating a greener cleaner environment for all who live work and visit Fingal.</p> <p>More effort to reduce fly tipping and removal of large refuse items from public spaces.</p> <p>CCTV monitoring to be installed of high incident areas of fly-tipping.</p> |
| <b>The Environment:</b><br>Plastics                        | <p>A campaign should be undertaken to promote the safe disposal of all plastic material, this should also include an approach to businesses groups to not use unrecyclable plastics in their food and drink sales, where avoidable.</p>  |

| <p><b>The Environment:</b><br/>Recycling Centres</p> | <p>Improve user compliance in relation to items being placed in the incorrect containers or mixed household rubbish in the plastic wrapper/ bag container at recycling centres. This can be done through examining the enforcement levels at recycling centres and targeting informal education interventions to increase levels of adherence and increase the awareness of customers.</p> <p>Raise community awareness of recycling centres in Fingal.</p>   |
| <p><b>The Environment:</b><br/>Sewerage</p>          | <p>To establish an evidenced informed programme that aims to reduce the negative impact of human and animal waste on public health and public spaces.</p> <p>New housing developments should be planned in coordination with sewerage facilities in order to ensure that appropriate permissions and planning are in place before constructions begins.</p> <p>A campaign is launched to explore feasibility of setting-up a tertiary treatment facility in order to process waste waters and eliminate micro-beads and other micro contaminants from water supply.</p> |
| <p><b>The Environment:</b><br/>Trees and Forests</p> | <p>A consultation with local residents in order to develop an implementation strategy for Fingal's Tree Strategy (i.e. Forrest of Fingal).</p> <p>Information is shared with local organisations and community groups about how to get involved in retaining and protecting trees and forests.</p>  |
| <p><b>Water:</b><br/>Greenway Project</p>            | <p>A community-wide strategy is developed to develop a greenway in Fingal in order to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Improve the maintenance of walking paths and tidal tracks.</li> <li>• Build tourist-friendly walkways and cycle paths along coastal areas.</li> </ul>   |
| <p><b>Water:</b><br/>Nitrates</p>                    | <p>Establish a river-basin management plan to ensure that there are limits placed on use of herbicides/ glysohates / pesticides.</p> <p>Campaign is developed to prevent over trawling of the local seabed and enforcement of fines and penalties.</p>  |

**Table 5: Issues Identified by the Housing and Homelessness Linkage Group**

| Thematic Area  | Issue   |

| <b>Housing:</b><br>Accessibility of Supports and Information | <p>Redesign and literacy proof all social housing support application forms at local level.</p> <p>Community organisations should receive on-going information from Fingal County Council regarding homeless issues.</p>  |
| <b>Housing:</b><br>Home Loans                                | <p>Where a homeowner is in risk of losing their home due to defaulting on a loan, Fingal County Council should explore the feasibility of operating a buy to let / mortgage to let scheme, where the owner of the home can remain as a tenant while paying rent to the council as a social tenant.</p>  |
| <b>Housing:</b><br>Rent                                      | <p>Fingal County Council should explore a potential pilot scheme that will support people who are caught up in a rental issue in which the Residential Tenancies Board has not been successful in resolving.</p>  |
| <b>Housing:</b><br>Single Person Accommodation               | <p>Fingal County Council to explore the building of student type accommodation for single people who need housing, similar to the multinational model of providing student type accommodation for their young executives.</p>   |
| <b>Housing:</b><br>Supply and Demand                         | <p>Construction needs to increase in order to meet the required demand. Demand should be met through both private sector build and local authority led schemes. Fingal County Council to continue to explore development of social and affordable housing and increase supports to build more homes.</p> <p>Fingal County Council to use compulsory purchase orders, where appropriate and where necessary, to purchase vacant homes for use as social units.</p> <p>Fingal County Council to provide a quicker turnaround of houses under their authority for distribution among people on the housing list.</p> |

| <p><b>Homelessness:</b><br/>Social and Health</p> | <p>A holistic approach to caring for and supporting a person experiencing homelessness is essential. A wide range of services should be provided for, including access to Doctors, nurses, counsellors, career guidance, education, etc. in order to empower the person experiencing homelessness.</p>   |
| <p><b>Homelessness:</b><br/>Supports</p>          | <p>People seeking emergency accommodation should be placed as close to their local support structures, as possible.</p> <p>To protect the human rights of the child and avoid long term social issues developing, and in the absence of appropriate accommodation being available, families should be placed in family hubs, rather than hotels.</p> <p>People living in homelessness or emergency accommodation often do not have access to washing or cooking facilities. Fingal to explore the establishment of communal centres for washing/cooking to facilitate people in this scenario.</p> |

| <b>Planning:</b><br>Communications       | <p>Interdepartmental communication should be encouraged and tracked to ensure that local issues are brought to the correct bodies within the Council, so these can be resolved as soon as possible.</p> <p>Fingal residents to be informed of new planning applications that bypass Fingal County Council and go straight to An Bord Pleanála by including these applications in the Weekly Planning List.</p>   |
| <b>Planning:</b><br>Enforcement          | <p>Ensure that the planning enforcement section in Fingal County Council is adequately resourced in order to ensure planning regulations are adhered to, thus ensuring the sustainable and appropriate development of the County.</p>  |
| <b>Planning:</b><br>Growing Population   | <p>Local Area Plans (LAPs) to ensure that all major infrastructure projects (sewage, roads etc.) and large-scale developments (more than 100 residential units) are future proofed.</p> <p>LAPs to identify through a needs assessment, requirements for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sports facilities (large and minority sports)</li> <li>• Schools</li> <li>• Community centres</li> <li>• Arts and performance facilities</li> </ul> |
| <b>Planning:</b><br>Infrastructure First | <p>Construction of sewage infrastructure to follow an ‘infrastructure first’ model as a planning permission condition for new housing.</p>   |
| <b>Planning:</b><br>New Communities      | <p>Occupiers of new residential units to be informed and given resources to support them to set up residents associations.</p>   |

| <p><b>Strategic Infrastructure:</b><br/>Dublin Airport</p>       | <p>The PPN to be kept informed of infrastructure projects relating to the airport including the proposed new runway and to be directly consulted with.</p> <p>DAA (Dublin Airport Authority) to be requested to monitor and publish reports on the level of noise pollution caused by the airport.</p> <p>The PPN to support engagement with the community regarding the proposed Airport Noise Regulator and separately, the development of a noise management plan. This should be accompanied with a meaningful mechanism to raise the community's concerns in relation to this.</p>  |
| <p><b>Strategic Infrastructure:</b><br/>Mobility and Funding</p> | <p>Accountability to be assigned to a specific department within Fingal County Council for implementation of the Mobility Management Plan.</p> <p>Certain roads in Fingal should be widened and made more accessible for people with disabilities using pathways, to reduce accidents.</p> <p>Fingal to have more investment in Transport Infrastructure as currently few new projects are being implemented (i.e. new bridges, footpaths).</p> <p>A needs analysis of key infrastructure to be undertaken to highlight gaps in infrastructure in Fingal. Investment for improvement to infrastructure to be made in priority areas.</p> |

**Table 7: Issues Identified by the Transport Linkage Group**

| Thematic Area                          | Issue   |

| <b>Transport:</b><br>Cycling           | <p>Rail to be made more accessible to cyclists to support tourist access and local commuting, which includes more space for bikes on trains and more bike parks at stations.</p> <p>Development of cycle routes and cycle lanes should be an essential inclusion in any future road works project.</p>  |
| <b>Transport:</b><br>Interconnectivity | <p>Plans need to support increased connectivity and integration between all modes of transport, including: car, rail, bus, cycle and pedestrian.</p> <p>Greater orbital bus connectivity is required within Fingal (i.e. Blanchardstown, Airport, Swords, Balbriggan, Rush and Lusk) and extended to major infrastructure in South Dublin County (Tallaght Hospital) and Dun Laoghaire Rathdown (University College Dublin) areas.</p>  |
| <b>Transport:</b><br>Public Transport  | <p>Fingal needs more investment into transport infrastructure. This investment needs to take account of growing usage.</p> <p>Metro Link needs to be prioritised and delivered to unlock future development capacity of the county.</p> <p>Dublin Bus routes should be reviewed with aim of decreasing the time and challenges of getting between towns and transport hubs in Fingal.</p> <p>Railway stations within Fingal to be reviewed for accessibility and improvements made for those with disabilities.</p> |
| <b>Transport:</b><br>Road Maintenance  | <p>Future proofing of the road system is necessary to accommodate the expected large scale residential development in Fingal County in the coming years.</p>  |
| <b>Transport:</b><br>Rural Transport   | <p>The existing rural transport programme (i.e. currently provided by Nifty) should be expanded in order to ensure that rural towns and villages have adequate access to public transport.</p>  |

# 09. Social Inclusion, Rural Development and Youth

**Table 8: Issues Identified by the Social Inclusion, Rural Development and Youth Linkage Group**

| Thematic Area                                 | Issue  |
|---|--|
| <b>Social Inclusion:</b><br>Facilities        | <p>It must always be ensured that all community centres are managed on a not-for-profit basis, led by a volunteer board, to make them as inclusive and accessible as possible.</p> <p>A review of planning policies should be undertaken to provide suitable access to facilities (community centres, etc.) for community groups and their activities.</p> |
| <b>Social Inclusion:</b><br>Funding           | <p>All local community funding scheme application forms and guidelines should be improved, streamlined and made more accessible on an on-going basis.</p> <p>Increased supports should be put in place to assist communities of most need to apply for funding.</p>  |
| <b>Social Inclusion:</b><br>Integration       | <p>Advocate for a strong Integration and Social Cohesion strategy for Fingal, to include the necessary road map on the provision of community development and education supports.</p>  |
| <b>Social Inclusion:</b><br>Service promotion | <p>Existing community services in Fingal, which include but is not limited to; mental health, unemployment, youth and elderly services to be better promoted so communities are aware of what services are available locally.</p>  |
| <b>Social Inclusion:</b><br>Unemployment      | <p>Trade and craft courses in Fingal should be mapped, some of which are covered by SICAP, in order to make this information available to the community.</p>   |
| <b>Rural Development:</b><br>Marina           | <p>Pursue that a feasibility study for the Fingal coastline to accommodate marina development is conducted.</p>  |

| <b>Rural Development:</b><br>Transport | <p>Investment needs to be made in an affordable and accessible (for disabled residents) transport for Fingal residents to link with facilities in Fingal.</p> <p>Links between bus and train services in Fingal to be improved.</p> <p>The existing Fingal Express bus service to be expanded.</p> <p>Fingal needs more investment in a bus service which links local communities to hospitals and other health services.</p>  |
| <b>Youth:</b><br>Education             | <p>Existing schools/colleges in Fingal to be used to promote Post Leaving Cert courses for early school leavers.</p> <p>Research to be carried out to investigate the viability of employer facilitated education schemes i.e. working for four days and attending education for one day a week.</p>   |
| <b>Youth:</b><br>Support Services      | <p>A strategy for young people in Fingal needs to be developed and implemented, to include how to deal with the volume of young people living in the area and how to include different cultures, as well as providing services to more regional areas.</p> <p>A signposting directory for young people trying to access drugs &amp; alcohol services needs to be developed.</p> <p>Research to be conducted to explore the viability of counselling drop-in services in towns to provide a space for young people to talk about their issues.</p> <p>A survey of young people in the county to be undertaken, to develop a roadmap of what services young people in the county require.</p> <p>Facilities such as skate parks and youth cafés should be developed.</p> |
