## LOCAL GOVERNMENT DECISION-MAKING

#### LOCAL GOVERNMENT – SPHERE OF INFLUENCE

- Powers are Limited
- One of the most centralised countries in Europe
- Limited amount of public affairs under LA control
- Limited financing
- Lack of formalised and regular engagement with central Government
- However:
- Local Economic and Community Development plans have improved
- LAs are connected with local citizens
- "citizens' participation in local public affairs is well developed through various forms of participatory democracy."

#### LOCAL AUTHORITY COMMITTEES

- Strategic Policy Committees (SPCs)
  - Housing
  - Arts, Culture, Leisure and Recreation
  - Finance
  - Climate Action, Environment and Energy
  - Planning
  - Transport
- Corporate Policy Groups (CPGs)
- Joint Policing Committees (JPCs)

There may also be other Council subcommittees, or area-based committees, depending on the council


## PPNS AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT

#### PPN ENGAGEMENT WITH LA COMMITTEES

- Have a place on Committees and can nominate Representatives
- Feed into Agenda and prepare discussion points
- Establish Linkage / Thematic Groups and use these groups as a conduit for information to / from Committees






### MAKING YOUR CASE

#### POSITIVE REPRESENTATION – BEFORE YOU START!

- Know what the committee can and cannot do
- Manage expectations of Linkage Group and committee
- · Be clear on what you want to achieve at each meeting
- Listen and learn
- Make specific input
- Influence others on specific topic
- Network
- Set agenda
- Be constructive
- Build alliances



#### MAKING YOUR CASE

- What is important to you and why?
- What does your PPN, the groups you represent, and the people they serve, need?
- How can you evidence that need?
- What's your solution? Can you cost it?
- How does your solution help the Local Authority meet its need?

- Change something?
- Keep it the way it is?

- Get more resources for an existing programme?

## WHAT WOULD SUCCESS LOOK LIKE? MAKING PROPOSALS

**Strategic** Researched and planned

**Series of Actions** Containing, where possible, a set of coordinated

activities

**Targeted** Aimed ultimately at the people with the power, but also

the general public

**Designed to** Arguments should be framed in a manner that

**Persuade** convinces people that the change is necessary, and

describes valid alternatives

**Build Alliances** Working with more stakeholders will increase the

impact. But be strategic

**Results in Change** The campaign should result in positive change for the

people who are affected

#### WHAT ARE THE OBSTACLES?

- Timing / Venue of meetings
- Access to documentation
- Timelines too tight
- Budget
- Lack of opportunity
- Getting issues onto the agenda
- How do you "go through" them?

#### **GROUP EXERCISE**

#### **EXAMPLE**

- PPN Proposal to Local Authority
- To commit to an additional 1,000 social housing units in 2024
- Key Considerations
- Tabling item for agenda on relevant committees

- Getting the votes
- Having the evidence of need

#### ARE THERE ALTERNATIVES?

- Look for alternative options which can be considered
- Parallel situation / pilot project/existing
- New ideas
- Proposals from other groups / counties
- Ideally start with a few options
- Know the history of policy solutions which worked and ones which didn't
- Project the outcomes / impacts
- Why should we change?

#### **POLICY IMPACTS**

- Be clear on the change you want to see
- Have relevant research ready
- Identify who the key stakeholders are (+/-)
- Analyse and understand current policy.
- Build alliances
- Frame alternative policy
- Decide how best to present it
- Follow up and persist (step by step)
