Fingal County Council is pleased to announce the launch of the International Women's Day Bursary 2026.

The theme for this year's International Women's Day is "Give to Gain", recognising the positive impact that supporting, empowering, and uplifting women has on our communities as a whole.

Through this bursary, the Community Development & Inclusion Office is allocating up to €300 towards small-scale, community-led events or activities that:

- **Celebrate women**
- **Support education or skills development**
- **Encourage social engagement**
- **Promote community development and/or women's empowerment**

Eligibility Criteria :

To apply, groups must:


- **Be registered with the Fingal Community County Register (PPN)**
- **Operate within the Fingal County Administrative Area**
- **Ensure their bursary-supported event takes place between Monday 2nd and Sunday 8th March 2026**
- **Submit only eligible costs for consideration (non-eligible costs cannot be funded)**

Groups must complete the IWD Funding Bursary section of the application form by 5pm on 30th January 2026. Applicants will need to provide the final details of their event, including:

- Event name
- Date and time

The Leadership Academy & Boardmatch Ireland: Future Board Leaders Programme

The Leadership Academy and Boardmatch Ireland are delighted to announce that they are now taking expressions of interest (EOI) for the 2026 Future Board Leaders (FBL) programme.



Now in its fourth year, it has supported placements of almost 50 new and diverse voices onto Irish charity and nonprofit boards, and is currently looking for the next class of candidates.

FBL identifies people from all walks of Irish life who have limited or no charity board experience, it provides free director training and matches charity boards with candidates based on their interests. Charities who are interested in diversifying their board are also currently being recruited to match with a diverse candidate.

Fingal's Age Friendly Strategy 2026-2030 is Launched Emphasising Participation and Accessibility

The Strategy, launched by Mayor of Fingal Cllr Tom O'Leary on 16 January 2026, sets out a clear and actionable roadmap to ensure Fingal continues to evolve as an age friendly county.



Fingal County Council was delighted to launch the third Fingal Age Friendly Strategy (2026-2030). The Strategy, launched by Mayor of Fingal Cllr Tom O'Leary on 16 January 2026, sets out a clear and actionable roadmap to ensure Fingal continues to evolve as an age friendly county, where older people are not only supported but actively included and empowered to thrive. The audience at the launch were addressed by Mayor O'Leary; Chair of the Chair of Fingal's Age Friendly Alliance, Senan Turnbull; Fingal's Age Friendly Ambassador, Terry Prone; and Chief Executive of Fingal County Council AnnMarie Farrelly and entertained by the Fingal Staff Choir.

Fingal is renowned for its youthful vibrancy, yet the county is experiencing a profound demographic shift. Today, 21% of the population is aged 55 and over and this cohort continues to grow. The Age Friendly Strategy reflects Fingal's commitment to building a county that values every stage of life, fosters meaningful connections, and ensures readiness to meet the evolving needs of an ageing population.

Developed by the Age Friendly Alliance, the Strategy is the culmination of extensive engagement with older people, stakeholders, and sectoral partners. Fingal's Age Friendly Ambassador, Terry Prone commended the work of the Alliance in developing the Strategy: "The mark of an unsuccessful strategy of any kind is where the people most affected go 'Why didn't you ask us?' That's what should make anybody living in Fingal feel hopeful about how this strategy will play out: We, the demographic, were asked. Consulted. Way to go..."



The Strategy is anchored in four thematic pillars that reflect the voice of older people:

- Health and Wellbeing**
- Mobility and Accessibility**
- Safe and Attractive Neighbourhoods**
- Information and Participation**

Delivery of the commitments will be driven by the Alliance through a comprehensive action plan and annual progress reports, ensuring accountability and impact.

Speaking at the launch Mayor of Fingal, Cllr. Tom O’Leary, said: “This Strategy is not simply a policy framework; it is a commitment. A commitment to our older residents that they will continue to be recognised, valued, and supported. A commitment to future generations that ageing in Fingal will be marked by dignity, opportunity, and belonging. It ensures that Fingal remains a place where ageing is embraced rather than feared, and where every citizen, regardless of age, can live with purpose, pride, and possibility.”

Grounded in rigorous research and shaped by meaningful consultation, the Fingal Age Friendly Strategy identifies the real challenges facing older people today and responds with a coordinated, multi-agency Action Plan. It reinforces Fingal’s leadership in advancing age friendly innovation through collaboration and genuine partnership with older residents.

From the lively streets of Blanchardstown to the charming coastal town of Skerries, each parade offers a unique celebration of Irish culture, music, and community spirit. Whether you're joining the festivities in Swords at 11am, soaking in the energy of Blanchardstown at 12pm, or enjoying the local charm of Balbriggan, Malahide, Rush, Lusk and Skerries, there's something for everyone.

Parade Locations;

Fingal proudly presents St Patrick's Day Parades in the following locations;

Blanchardstown 12pm: Join the festivities in Blanchardstown, where the streets come alive with the infectious energy of St Patrick's Day. The route runs from the junction of Church Avenue, Mill Road & Mary Street, Main Street, past Clonsilla Road Junction and finishes at Blanchardstown Garda Station.

Swords 11am: Swords is all set to host a spectacular parade that captures the heart of Irish tradition and heritage. The route runs from Colaiste Choilm, Dublin Road along Main Street, turning right at Bridge Street junction, along North Street and finishing at Swords Castle Town Park.

Balbriggan 12pm: Balbriggan's parade promises a delightful blend of community enthusiasm and Irish flair. The route runs from Bremore Castle car park, Drogheda Street, Dublin Street to St Pater's and Paul Catholic Church.

Malahide 2pm: Experience the charm of Malahide as it transforms into a hub of St Patrick's Day excitement. The route runs from The Cricket Club, Malahide Road R106 from the junction of Yellow Walls Road, Main Street, The Mall, Coast Road and finishes at the Beach Car Park.

Rush 1pm: Community ran parade, see: Rush Community Council. The route runs from Lower Main Street, Bawn Road, Kilbush Lane to Chapel Green.

Lusk 1:30pm: Community ran parade, see: Lusk Community Council. The route runs from the R127 Ring Road to Station Road, Main Street, Post Office Road to The Green.

Skerries 3pm: Community ran parade, see: Skerries Chamber of Commerce. The route runs from South Strand Street to Strand Street.
